

## April 2, 2022 (day 38)

Since the beginning of the armed aggression, the Russian military has shelled 274 hospitals (13 hospitals have been completely destroyed) and disabled 70 ambulances. 6 medical workers were killed and 20 were seriously injured.

Last night, April 1, more than 30 missiles were fired from Belarus into Ukraine.

During the day on April 1, 7 people died in **Donetsk region**.

On April 1, more than 3,000 people were evacuated from **Mariupol**.

Tonight, the occupiers fired a missile at an infrastructure facility in the city of **Poltava**. Several strikes were also carried out on infrastructure facilities and residential buildings in Kremenchug.

At night, shelling was carried out from multiple rocket launchers near **Kryvyi Rih**. A gas station caught fire in the city. In **Dnipro**, Russian missiles hit an infrastructure facility, injuring two people.

In the temporarily occupied territories of **Zaporizhia** oblast, the occupiers are detaining civilians and interrogating activists. Local activists were detained during a peaceful meeting in support of Ukraine in **Energodar**. Explosions and mass shelling erupted in the city center.

In **Melitopol**, the Russian military is deploying artillery systems among residential areas, from where they carry out shelling in the direction of Zaporozhia.

When leaving **Bucha**, Russian occupation forces mined civilian infrastructure and terrain. In **Kyiv**, 154 houses, 20 private houses, 27 kindergartens, and 44 schools were damaged.

**Chernihiv** remains blocked and is under artillery fire on residential areas of the city. The blockade and shelling of the city of **Kharkiv** also continues. Fighting for Izyum continues in Kharkiv region.

In the **Luhansk region**, the cities of Severodonetsk, Rubizhne, Lysychansk, Kreminna, Horsk, and Toshkivka came under heavy fire.

In **Kherson** more than 100 inhabitants of the city - activists, local deputies were kidnapped. Tavriya Mayor Mykola Rizak was abducted.

Last night, the Russian military launched a triple missile strike from the Iskander complex on a settlement in the Odessa region. It was planned to hit critical infrastructure, but the missiles hit other targets.

According to the Ministry of Culture, the occupiers **damaged 135 monuments of cultural heritage of Ukraine**, including 5 monuments of national importance. Religious buildings suffered the most - 59 objects. Twenty-five historic buildings from the second half of the 19th to the beginning of the 20th century were damaged. The destruction of such facilities is a war crime under the provisions of the 1954 Hague Convention.
